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DESCRIPTION:	Oceanfront within the world-famous Kā'anapali Beach Resort, the 430-room Kā'anapali Beach Hotel is set majestically on a three-mile stretch of sandy beach along the sunny western shores of Maui. The resort offers an ideal setting for a memorable Hawaiian experience.
ACCOMODATIONS:	<p>430 rooms (416 guest rooms, 14 suites) in four wings. The lush tropical courtyard is filled with gardens, walkways, a whale-shaped swimming pool, and an outdoor bar and grill opening onto Kā'anapali Beach – one of the world's most beautiful beaches.</p> <p>Each room is approximately 425 square feet complete with airy island decor, private lānai/balcony, air-conditioning, mini-refrigerator, clock radio, color cable television, in-room safe, iron and ironing board, hairdryer and coffee maker. Full tub with shower in Maui, Lāna'i, and Kaua'i wings; shower only in the Moloka'i wing. The hotel has designated 80% of the rooms non-smoking; the Maui and Moloka'i buildings are entirely non-smoking.</p> <p>In-room services include high-speed Internet, voice mail, on screen television express checkout and movies on demand.</p>
SPECIAL SERVICES:	Welcome breakfast upon arrival. Kukui lei ceremony upon departure.
HAWAIIAN ACTIVITIES:	A variety of complimentary Hawaiian activities are scheduled daily. Among them are poi making, 'ukulele lessons, a children's choir, lau printing,

ti-leaf skirt making, hula classes, lei making, lauhala weaving, garden tours, haku flower lei making, hula implement demonstrations, pineapple cutting, sand images, Hawaiian art legacy tours, and crafts fairs.

CHILDREN’S PROGRAM:

“Aloha Passport for Kids” is an unsupervised amenity program, received at check-in, and free for children 12 years and younger. A child’s first stop is Guest Services, where they receive an “Aloha Passport” featuring various “destinations” located throughout the property. Children 6-12 years old can experience 12 destinations and children 3-5 years old have an eight-destination passport with activities geared toward a younger child. At each destination, children receive a gift and a stamp in their passport. When the child arrives at the destination, his/her Aloha Passports are stamped with a Hawaiian word and the child receives an amenity. The amenities include fun items to play with during their stay, and become memorable keepsakes of their visit to Maui. Infants through two years old receive a passport card with their personalized Hawaiian name and a sand pail filled with baby beach toys. If parents need a break from all the fun, the hotel’s Guest Services can arrange for babysitting or participation in one of the resort’s recreation programs.

RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES:

Whale-shaped swimming pool, beach activity center that has rentals including snorkel and boogie boards, a beach catamaran offering cocktail, snorkel, sunset sails, and seasonal whale watching cruises.

Other activities include a giant checkerboard and a ping-pong table. Hiking and horseback riding are available nearby. Complimentary Hawaiian arts, crafts, and demonstrations are offered throughout the week.

DINING:

Kā’anapali Beach Hotel offers a range of dining and entertainment options.

Tiki Terrace Restaurant

Features award-winning Hawai‘i regional cuisine for breakfast and dinner in an open-air setting. Hawaiian hula show nightly with dancing under the stars.

Kā’anapali Mixed Plate Restaurant

A favorite spot for locals and visitors to enjoy an all-you-can-eat buffet at an affordable price. Serves breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Tiki Grill Poolside grill open daily serving lunch and pupus (appetizers).

Tiki Bar Poolside bar open daily.

ENTERTAINMENT:

Sunset torch lighting ceremony and a complimentary hula show are performed nightly outdoors in the Tiki Terrace Courtyard. Enjoy Hawaiian music and dancing under the stars.

KĀ‘ANAPALI BEACH RESORT:

The Kā‘anapali Beach Hotel is situated in the heart of the Kā‘anapali Beach Resort. The resort overflows with options for outdoor recreation enthusiasts.

Golf The Kā‘anapali Golf Courses, home to the Wendy’s Champions Skins Tournament, features two championship golf courses designed by Robert Trent Jones (Tournament North) and Arthur Jack Snyder (Resort South). Green fees include a shared cart. Also available: driving range, putting green, club storage, top-of-the-line golf equipment, club and shoe rentals, and apparel for men and women. Free transportation available by resort shuttle. Kā‘anapali Beach Hotel room and golf packages are available.

Tennis A variety of tennis facilities and pro shops are located in the Kā‘anapali Resort.

Sun & Sand The beautiful golden sand of Kā‘anapali Beach is a natural focal point for fun and relaxation while on Maui.

Ocean Activities Whale watching from December through April. Year ‘round boating, diving, fishing, swimming, snorkeling, windsurfing, and surfing. Seasonal parasailing and water skiing (May through November.)

Shopping Set beachfront in the center of the resort, the Whalers Village Shopping Center & Museum offers fine shops and restaurants.

Whalers Village is also home to a museum featuring the history of whaling in Hawai‘i. Whalers Village is just a short stroll down the beach walkway from Kā‘anapali Beach Hotel.

LĀHAINĀ TOWN

History Favored by Hawai‘i’s royalty for its climate, location, and surfing, Lāhainā Town was once home to Kamehameha III and was the unofficial capitol of the Hawaiian Islands. In the early 1800s, Lāhainā became a major stopping place for the whaling ships of the Pacific. Soon after,

missionaries from America began settling in the town. It did not take long for the staid missionaries and rambunctious seamen to engage in a long-running dispute that occasionally erupted into physical confrontations. Peace finally came when the whaling era ended. For many years thereafter the prime sources of employment for Lāhainā's people were the sugar and pineapple plantations. All of that changed, of course, with the rise of the visitor industry, which brought about the revitalization of Lāhainā. The town is a windfall for sightseers, history buffs, art enthusiasts, ocean explorers, shoppers, and fun-seekers in general.
