Accommodations	<p>432 rooms (418 guest rooms, 14 suites) in four wings. The 4 acre tropical courtyard, surrounds the hotel’s signature whale-shaped pool and opens onto Kā’anapali Beach – one of the world’s most beautiful beaches.</p> <p>Each room is approximately 425 square feet complete with comfortable air-conditioning, airy island decor, private lanai/balcony, mini-refrigerator, clock radio, color cable television, in-room safe, iron and ironing board, hairdryer and coffee maker. Voltage: 110-120. Full tub with shower in Maui, Lana‘i, and Kaua‘i wings; shower only in the Moloka‘i wing. The hotel rooms are designated 80% non-smoking. The Maui and Moloka‘i buildings are entirely non-smoking. Rollaway beds are available for an additional fee and infant cribs are free.</p> <p>In-room services include high-speed Internet service (\$9.95 plus taxes per day charge), voicemail, on screen television express check-out and movies on demand. (Note: In accordance with Kā’anapali Beach Hotel’s family-style hospitality, movie categories beyond R-ratings are not offered in our guest rooms.) Wi-Fi is not available in room.</p>

GUEST SERVICES

Facilities	Daily maid service, concierge, ATM machine, coin-operated laundry or same-day valet service, baby-sitting, safe deposit box, tour desk, self and valet parking, shops, full-service spa salon, restaurants and poolside bar/grill on property. Lobby arts and crafts fair daily. Ice, beverage, and snack machines. Beach activities center and conference rooms.
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GUEST SERVICES (continued)

Free Hawaiian Activities	A variety of free Hawaiian activities are scheduled daily. Among them are hula classes, lei making, 'ukulele lessons, lauhala weaving, cultural garden tours, pineapple cutting, sand images, Mo'olelo story telling, Hawaiian language lessons, and note card making.
Entertainment	Sunset torch lighting ceremony and a complimentary hula show are performed nightly outdoors in the Tiki Terrace Courtyard. Enjoy Hawaiian music and dancing until 9:00pm.
Children's Program	"Aloha Passport for Kids" is an unsupervised amenity program, free for children 12 years and younger. At check-in, every family receives information that explains the program. The children's first stop is Guest Services, where they may receive an "Aloha Passport" featuring various "destinations" located throughout the property. Children 6-12 years old can experience 12 destinations and children 3-5 years old have an 8-destination passport with activities geared toward the younger child. At each destination, children receive an amenity and a stamp in their passport. The amenities include fun items to play with during their stay, and become memorable keepsakes of their visit to Maui. Infants through 2-year-olds receive a passport card with their personalized Hawaiian name and a sand pail full of baby goodies. If parents need a break from all the fun, the hotel's Guest Services can arrange for babysitting or participation in one of the resort's recreation programs.
Sports & Recreational Activities	<p>Whale-shaped swimming pool open from 8:00am-8:00pm. SCUBA lessons are available in the pool daily. Beach activity center located on property has rentals including snorkel and SCUBA equipment, boogie boards, beach chairs, umbrella sets, beach cabanas and a beach catamaran offering cocktail, snorkel, sunset sails, and seasonal whale watching cruises.</p> <p>Other activities include a giant checkerboard and a ping-pong table. Hiking and horseback riding are available nearby. Complimentary Hawaiian arts, crafts, and demonstrations are offered throughout the week.</p>

KĀ'ANAPALI BEACH RESORT

The Kā'anapali Beach Hotel is situated in the heart of the Kā'anapali Beach Resort. The resort overflows with options for outdoor recreation enthusiasts.

Golf The Kā'anapali Golf Courses, home to the Wendy's Champions Skins Tournament, feature two championship golf courses designed by Robert Trent Jones (Tournament North) and Arthur Jack Snyder (Resort South). Green fees include a shared cart. Also available: driving range, putting green, club storage, top-of-the-line golf equipment, club and shoe rentals, and apparel for men and women. Free transportation is available on Kā'anapali Resort shuttle. Detailed information on other Maui golf courses is available.

Exercise Facilities	Exercise facilities (free weights and treadmills) are available in the Kā‘anapali Resort. Access fees: approximately \$20.00 per person, per day or \$65.00 per person, per week. Expanded services are available at a local gym located in the Fairway Shops above the golf course along Honoapi‘ilani Highway. Discounts are offered to hotel guests presenting their room key at the membership desk.
Tennis	There are 35 professional tennis courts and a tennis stadium at six locations in the Kā‘anapali Resort area. Guests may contact Guest Services for price details and reservations.
Sun & Sand	The beautiful golden sand of Kā‘anapali Beach is a natural focal point for fun and relaxation while on Maui.
Ocean Activities	Whale watching from approximately December through April. Boating, diving, fishing, swimming, snorkeling, windsurfing and surfing year round. Parasailing, and water skiing are available May 15 – December 15.
Shopping	<p>Set beachfront in the center of the resort, the Whalers Village Shopping Center & Museum offers over 60 fine shops and restaurants. Open from 9:30am-10:00pm, seven days a week, Whalers Village is a shopper’s paradise featuring Maui’s best assortment of art galleries, quality fashion, jewelry, and dining. Whalers Village is also home to a museum featuring the history of whaling in Hawai‘i. Whalers Village is just a short stroll down the beach walkway from Kā‘anapali Beach Hotel.</p> <p>In addition, all of the hotels in the resort have shopping arcades open to the public.</p>

LĀHAINĀ TOWN

History	Favored by Hawai‘i’s royalty for its climate, location, and surfing, Lāhainā Town was once home to Kamehameha III and was the royal capitol of the Hawaiian Islands. In the early 1800’s, Lāhainā became a major stopping place for the whaling ships of the Pacific. Soon after, missionaries from America began settling in the town.
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LĀHAINĀ TOWN (continued)

History (continued) It did not take long for the staid missionaries and rambunctious seamen to engage in a long-running dispute that occasionally erupted into physical confrontations. Peace finally came when the whaling era ended. For many years thereafter the prime sources of employment for Lāhainā's people were the sugar and pineapple plantations. All of that changed, of course, with the rise of the visitor industry, which brought about the revitalization of Lāhainā. The town is a windfall for sightseers, history buffs, art enthusiasts, ocean explorers, shoppers, and fun-seekers in general.

Shopping Just three miles south of the resort is Lāhainā Town, a lively little port that is one of Maui's top visitor attractions with a special charm that contributes to its rich heritage. Lāhainā is home to some of the finest eateries, art galleries, and shopping in the Pacific. Built on the water's edge, the town has several sites and artifacts from its royal Hawaiian past, its whaling and missionary era, and its days as a multi-ethnic plantation town. Attractions include movie theaters, traditional Hawaiian entertainment, unique theatrical productions, and nightclubs.

At the north end of Lāhainā sits Lāhainā Cannery Mall. Once a working pineapple cannery, it has been tastefully converted into a contemporary shopping mall featuring more than 50 boutique retail stores and restaurants. As Maui's only fully enclosed, air-conditioned mall, it is a popular place for shopping, dining and enjoying Hawaiian entertainment. Anchor stores are Safeway and Long's Drugs. Free parking and convenient shuttle service are available. Mall hours are 9:30am-9:00pm.

TRANSPORTATION

Domestic Airlines Maui is served by two airports, The Kahului Airport (OGG) is twenty-five miles from Kā'anapali Beach Hotel. Located four miles to the north is the Kapalua West Maui Airport (JHM), which is limited to inter-island passengers.

Airport Transportation From Kahului Airport, via taxi: approximately \$85. Shuttle services available. We suggest Maui Executive Transportation, 1-800-833-2303, or Speedi Shuttle, 1-877-242-5777 for current price and schedules.

From Kapalua Airport, via taxi: approximately \$20.

Rental Cars Rental cars are available at both airports.

Resort Transportation From 9:00am-11:00pm, the Kā‘anapali Resort trolley provides free transportation for resort guests between all of the resort hotels and condominiums, the golf courses, and Whalers Village Shopping Center. From approximately 6:00am-9:00pm, the Maui Bus provides transportation from the Kā‘anapali Resort area to the Lāhainā Cannery Mall and Lāhainā Town. The current one-way charge is \$2.00 per person (subject to change). Day passes are available at \$4.00 per person (subject to change). Pick-up location is at the Whalers Village Shopping Center.

The “Sugar Cane Train” (The Lāhainā, Kā‘anapali & Pacific Railroad) is a pleasurable transportation alternative between Kā‘anapali and Lāhainā Town. It is a vintage steam locomotive reminiscent of the engines used to haul sugar cane from island fields to the mill at the turn of the century. The 200-passenger train operates daily from 9:00am-4:00pm. Schedule and current pricing available at www.sugarcaneTrain.com.
