Activities

HULA

You will walk away from this class knowing that hula is more than just a Hawaiian form of dance. Learn the importance of how the hula preserves our culture, language, history, and stories of Hawai'i.

'ŌLELO (HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE)

Learn the correct pronunciation of the Hawaiian alphabet, some common words and sentences, as well as the history of the near extinction and revitalization of our native language.

MA'AWE (NATIVE FIBERS) *

Discover different weaving techniques and the materials used. Plus make something to take home.

LEI (TRADITIONAL METHODS) *

Learn about the different lei making styles, gain knowledge about the significance of lei, the traditional uses, gathering protocols, and learn to fashion your own lei to take away.

KILOMOANA (ETHNOECOLOGY)

Learn the ocean's role in Hawaiian life and the connection each of the beach boys have with it. Come talk to a surfer, navigator, paddler, or fisherman who will share their knowledge of our ocean resources.

MEA HO'OKANI (INSTRUMENTS) *

It's your opportunity to see and try out the different Hawaiian "musical" instruments. Learn how and why each was used, then make your very own instrument to keep.

MO'OLELO (STORY TELLING)

Participants will learn about Maui, Hawaiian culture, spirituality, and language through story telling. Guests are welcome to bring questions and be involved in conversation.

KAPA (CLOTH-PRINTING) *

Learn how Hawaiian cloth was made and see the plants that were used. You will experience the process from beginning to end and decorate your own small piece of kapa (cloth).

MELE (MUSIC & 'UKULELE)

Discover Hawaiian music and songs and learn a few chords on the 'ukulele and Hawaiian words in a mele. The development of Hawaiian music will be covered with examples of different genres.

MĀLAMA 'AINA (ETHNOBOTANY) *

Learn Hawaiian terminology associated with plants and farming, mannerisms of food cultivation and preparation, and its spiritual connection. Plus take part in the processing and production of traditional foods.

HO'OLAULE'A (CELEBRATION)

Join the Hale Ho'okipa staff in the lobby in a music session where everyone, of any ability, is invited to play music, dance hula, sing along, or just enjoy.
